Nirmalya Dey is a renowned master vocalist and teacher in the tradition of Dagarvani Dhrupad. He holds a BA and MA in Indian Classical Vocal Music and studied under Dhrupad Master vocalist Ustad Zia Fariduddin Dagar for twenty-five years. Nirmalya Dey has received numerous awards as a performer and teacher in India, Europe and the United States. Nirmalya will be accompanied by Ilyas Nadjafi and Alexis Weisgerber on pakawaj drum.

About Dhrupad

Dhrupad is an ancient form of sacred Indian music which has its roots in temple culture dating back to the time of the Vedas. The real purpose of Dhrupad is not merely to entertain, but to expand human consciousness.



Concert Naada Om and friends

Saturday July 27 14.30h – 16.00h

Naada Om is a World Music collaboration between composer, singer, harmonium player Felix Woldenberg and percussionist, arranger Alan Corne. Felix Woldenberg studied under various Indian Masters in the Dhrupad and Quawwali traditions and has been involved in sacred chanting since his childhood. Percussionist Alan Corne holds a MA in Contemporary Music. He has studied both Western and Eastern modalities and has practiced sacred music for more than thirty years.

Naada Om's music can be divided into three categories:

- Devotional songs or Bhajans — based on traditional call-and-response chanting;
- Mantric chants — generally slow chants sung in unison utilizing mantras;
- Sacred offerings — encompassing elements of Western classical harmony, Bhajans, and Dhrupad, Hindustani; Qawwali traditions — in which the audience participates as listeners.
